

Behavioral-Based Safety Management

- Encourages Near Miss reporting.
- Encourages safe performance by self assessment as a supplement to mandatory procedures and safe practices.
- Stop Work Authority is given to all on site. Acting on that authority is mandated.

Elements of Safety Management

- Written program
- Training
- Daily toolbox and subcontractor coordination meetings
- Perform Job Hazard Analysis before performing the work
- Self assessment: Assess the risk, Analyze how to reduce the risk, and Act to ensure safe operations
- Near Miss Reporting
- Incident investigation, corrective action followup, and reporting back to employees
- Subcontractor preselection: Only work with those who have a safety program and statistics to prove their success
- Every person on site is given Stop Work Authority
- If it isn't safe, don't do it
